

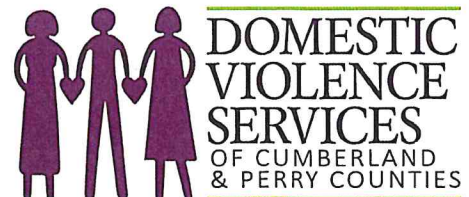

- **24/7 HOTLINE/TEXTLINE:** speak to a trained trauma informed DV advocate at any time. Advocates can assist with safety planning, crisis counseling, questions & concerns regarding next steps, completing an intake for services, finding resources and aid in the community, and more. The hotline is open to EVERYONE; friends, family, and other members of a survivors support team are welcome to call in regarding advice to support the individual as well as general questions surrounding DV/IPV. ***All services require a hotline intake.**
- **EMERGENCY SHELTER:** for those in immediate or imminent danger a safe & confidential location is available.
- **LEGAL ADVOCACY:** legal advocates can assist with filing for and accompanying individuals with filing: Protection from Abuse Orders (PFA), Warning Letters, and with the Victim's Compensation Assistance Program (VCAP) paperwork. Legal advocates also hold options appointments to explain legal avenues to survivors and find what service best fits and supports them.
- **ADULT & CHILD COUNSELING:** Counseling is available for children five and older and all adults. Individual counseling & support group counseling is available. Counseling can be done in person, over the phone, or through zoom.
- **PREVENTION EDUCATION & OUTREACH:** free educational services are provided to the community. Programming can be made custom to the interests & concerns of community groups/businesses/agencies/etc.
- **AMEND:** 26 session virtual program for those who abuse/batter their partners or others whom they have an intimate relationship.
